## Project Update

## Overnight closures of the A9 and traffic management alterations

Three overnight closures of the A9 north of Perth, between Luncarty Junction and the A923 Dunkeld Junction, northbound and southbound, are planned on the following nights:

- **Wednesday 12th February 2020 (8:30pm to 6am)**
- **Thursday 13th February 2020 (8:30pm to 6am)**
- **and if necessary, Friday 14th February 2020 (10pm to 6am)**

These closures are required to safely lift and install the precast concrete beams that will form the deck of the new Gelly Overbridge and to make alterations to the traffic management between Luncarty and the Stanley/Tullybelton Junction for the next phase of works.

### Traffic Management Alterations

From 6am on Friday 14 February, right turns from the northbound A9 into the C569 Strathford Station Road (leading to the B9099 Stanley Road) will be prohibited. A diversion via Bankfoot will be in place until the new Luncarty link road becomes operational in Spring 2021. This will allow us to commence works on the new southbound carriageway.

As traffic management layouts will change, we are asking drivers to approach the area with care and observe all signage.

These works are weather dependent as heavy lifting operations are sensitive to high winds. As such, our contractor has included Friday 14th February, as a contingency date. In the event that the works are completed on the first two nights, the third overnight closure will not be required. If forecast weather for all dates is poor, then the closures may be postponed.
